As per agenda the following points were discussed, and resolutions were taken which are furnished below:

34.01 Approval of the Minutes of 33rd BOG Meeting:

Minutes of the 33rd BOG Meeting held on 25th September 2021 duly signed by Hon'ble Chairman and Member Secretary was tabled for kind approval of the Hon'ble members. The MS pointed out the salient features of those minutes.


The Minutes of 33rd BOG meeting was unanimously accepted and approved by all BOG members.

34.02 Report of Member Secretary as well as action taken report (as per resolution of 33rd BOG meeting)

The Member Secretary put forward a warm welcome to all the Hon'ble Members of the BOG to the 34th meeting of the board at the college. As Member Secretary of the BOG, he apprised of the various developments of the college after the last BOG held on 25th September 2021.

- The MS happily informed the Hon'ble members that the college had successfully submitted the Institutional Information for Quality Assurance (IIQA) on 24-12-2021. Subsequently, the NAAC allowed the college to submit the Self Study Report (SSR) on or before 13th March 2022, which was successfully uploaded on 8th March 2022. Thereafter, few Data Verification and Validation (DVV) queries on Quantitative matrices were successfully answered on 5th April 2022. On 13th June 2022, the NAAC informed through their portal that the college had successfully qualified in the pre-qualifier stage of DVV and asked for suitable visit dates post payment of the remaining instalment of fees. The college had provided three sets of on-site visit dates for NAAC peer team starting from 18th/19th July, 3rd/4th and 19th/20th August 2022 as per their guidelines. The college was waiting for their confirmation of the final peer team visit dates.
- The Member Secretary apprised the board members regarding the submission of extension of approval/ affiliation documents to PCI, AICTE and MAKAUT for AY 2022-23. The PCI submissions were done in the month of December 2021 with application for starting two new M. Pharm courses in the specializations of Pharmaceutical Analysis and Industrial Pharmacy. Accordingly, in the month of

April 2022, the college had submitted to the AICTE the application for EoA along two new PG courses. Similarly, the SAR was submitted to the University for the same in March 2022 and the online inspection for the courses was conducted by the University on 1st April 2022. Subsequently, the AICTE had conducted two online Scrutiny meetings (25th May and 17th June 2022) with the college. The college was waiting for surprise inspection from PCI any day as per their notification in the PCI website.

- The MS reminded everyone that during the previous BOG meeting, the admissions were going on for various courses run by the college for AY 2021-22. He happily informed the members that for AY 2021-22, the college achieved 100% admission for all the courses (i.e., D. Pharm-60, B. Pharm – 104, B. Pharm lateral - 13 and M. Pharm - 30) through the respective entrance examinations.
- The Second Graduation Day Ceremony of the College was held on 19th December 2021 (Sunday) to hand over the pass certificates of 2019-20 batch students, informed the MS. The Controller of Examination, MAKAUT, WB Dr. Subhasis Dutta and Dr. Sanmoy Karmakar, HOD, Dept of Pharmaceutical Technology, Jadavpur University were the Chief Guest and Guest of Honour respectively in the program. Eighty Nine (89) students who could attend the physical graduation ceremony were handed over their degree certificates and the guests and dignitaries including the General Secretary, Mr Tarun Bhattacharya, Director, Dr. Subrata Chakraborty, Principal and Registrar of the College addressed the gathering and blessed the students.
- During the time interval between the 33rd and 34th BOG, the college conducted 04 offline and 01 online seminars and 1 online workshop.
 - A seminar on “Campus to Corporate -Professional Development Training Program” by Mr. Subhabrata Dutttagupta, Process Manager, Novartis Global Drug Development, was organized on 23rd December 2021.
 - A seminar on the topic “Pharmaceutical career opportunities in modern era & Research methodology of Pharmaceutical investigation with Statistical approach” by Mr. Sayan Chatterjee, Site Investigator and Statistician, Dr. Reddys Laboratories Ltd., Hyderabad and was attended by 93 students on 11th April 2022.
 - The IQAC of BCRCP organized a five day (23/30 April, 7/14/21 May 2022) Workshop on “Pharmaceutical Quality Management System along with QC, QA and GMP” where Mr. Sudipta Dey, Former Dy. Drugs Controller, Govt of India acted as the Trainer / Facilitator. The workshop was attended by 122 students of PCI approved Pharmacy colleges.
 - Another seminar on “Regenerative Medicine & Application of AI in Regenerative Medicine” was organized on 20th May 2022 wherein Dr. Amitabha Bhattacharya, Research School of Tropical Medicine and Mr. Souva Majumder, Director of Apollonius Computational Business Solutions Pvt Ltd.

enlightened 111 odd participants on the cutting edge of regenerative medicine and artificial intelligence applications in that field.

- An webinar on “Importance of profession ready Training in Clinical Research and Pharmacovigilance” was organized by BCRCP in collaboration with Clini India Pvt Ltd on 21st May 2022 with 100 participants from the college.
- Finally, on 30th May 2022 Mr. Arpan Ganguly, Brand Manager, Anglo French Drugs, Bengaluru, India delivered a lecture on “Scope of Pharmaceutical Management and Advances in Intellectual Property Rights” to an audience of 107 students.
- A Bootcamp on “Molecules to Medicine” for 2 days (19th & 20th April 2022) was organized by the college in association RxCella, Hyderabad, wherein Mr. Bedadyuti Chakraborty, Former Director, Biologicals Training Center, Dr. Reddy’s, Hyderabad acted as the resource person. It was attended by 45 selected students of B. Pharm and M. Pharm final year for preparing them for job roles in the industry.
- A West Bengal Govt. sponsored 3-days “Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp: New Age Startup” was organized by the college in association with SHRM Biotech and Wadhani Foundation for the students, wherein 93 students from BCRCP and four other nearby Pharmacy colleges participated. The program included interactions with Mr. Amiya Kumar Kalidaha, Sr. Scientific Officer, DST-BT, GoWB, Mr. Suvendu Biswas, DIC, Paschim Bardhaman, Directorate of MSME, GoWB, Mr. Prosenjit Lal, Cluster Head, Axis Bank, Durgapur, Mr. Kunal Vora, Director, SHRM Biotechnologies Pvt Ltd, Mr. Saurav Jaiswal, Founder, Diverse Genomics Pvt. Ltd., Prof. Debarshi Dey, Entrepreneurship Development Cell, GNIT and Dr. Priyansha Chatterjee, Ophthalmologist and Founder, Dvita Eye Care, Durgapur. The program offered an industry visit to nearby factories. The program was received favourably by the students who learnt the diverse arena of starting a new enterprise and how to avail loans from banks for start ups. The students presented their business models and ideas through group presentations to a panel of judges. The program grant of Rs. 50000/- from GoWB was received by our faculty, Dr. Souvik Basak, Associate Professor of Chemistry, who acted as the Coordinator of the program to make it a success with the help of his team including the E-Cell of the College.
- During the period between 33rd and 34th BOG meeting, there had been transition from online to offline classes from 16th November 2021 upto the Christmas Eve as per GoWB order. Subsequently, due to surge in the pandemic, the online classes were again held in January 2022, but fortunately the college resume the offline academic activities from 3rd February 2022 following govt orders. The end semester examination for the odd semester, was however, held for both B. Pharm and M. Pharm through online proctored mode by the University during January and March (for 1st year students) 2022. The final examinations for even semester 2021-22 were going on in online proctored mode. The WBSCT&VE&SD had not notified the final

dates and mode of examination for D. Pharm Part I and II till then, reported the Member Secretary.

- Due to a part of the year elapsed under pandemic related lockdown; the placement scenario had not been at the same level as previous years. Till then 97 jobs for final year students could be secured, though several more companies had expressed their willingness to come for campus interview. More than 70 students were trying for higher education out of total 205 final year students of Diploma (59), undergraduate (115) and post-graduate (31) courses. The higher studies data was evolving as the admissions were starting pan-India. The projected combined placement and higher education rate as it stood was 80.5%. The details were presented by the TPO and the data was discussed under Agenda no. 34.05.
- The Member Secretary informed the Hon'ble members that 10 of our students had qualified in GPAT 2022 and 1 student had qualified in GATE 2022 examinations. One student, Mr. Kalapataru Mitra had secured 22nd rank in the NIPER – JEE 2022.
- During the period between the 33rd and 34th BOG, a sum of Rs. 80,000/- was provided from internal funds of the college to 9 faculties for research purpose, one faculty Dr. Yadunandan Dey, Associate Professor of Pharmacology, had received a project grant of Rs. 31.60 lakhs from DST-SERB and 41 papers in national and international journals had been published by the faculty. The detailed report was given as Annexure – I.
- During the interval between the 33rd and 34th BOG meeting, several extra-curricular activities had been conducted in the college, both physically and virtually.
 - The World Pharmacist Day was celebrated online on 25th September 2021 through competitions such as Poster display, Quiz, Essay writing, etc. along with talks delivered by Dr. Partha Pal, Medical Superintendent of The Mission Hospital, Durgapur and their Dietician. The highlight of the program was message from eminent cardiac surgeon Dr. Satyajit Bose, our Society President and Chairman of The Mission Hospital, Durgapur as well as the message from Dr. Suhrita Pal, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata. The pre-recorded messages were relayed online to the participants on the occasion.
 - On 28th September 2021 a Yoga Session was organized for the first year entrants as part of the Students' Induction Program.
 - On 29th September 2021, Dr. Sanmoy Karmakar, HOD, Dept of Pharmaceutical Technology, Jadavpur University addressed the new entrants to B. Pharm of the college on "Pharmacy as a career" as part of the technical talks organized during SIP.
 - The Orientation Program for M. Pharm was organized on 7th October 2021 and for D. Pharm on 4th Jan 2022 in online mode

34.03 Budget FY 2022-2023

The proposed budget for FY 2022-23 was placed on record for finalization by the Hon'ble Members. The actual expenses for FY 2021-22 and the budgeted expenses for FY 2022-23 was given in Annexure – II.

34.04 Result Analysis of Odd Semester AY: 2021-2022

The result analysis data and comparative pictorial representation was presented for odd semester AY 2021-22 in Annexure – III.

It could be understood clearly that compared to previous semesters, results of the odd semesters of AY 2021-22 has been fairly good. However, it should be pointed out that due to lockdown, the conventional pen-paper examination could not be held and the exams were held digitally through MCQ based proctored examination mode. The results of D. Pharm Part I for AY 2020-21, which is now available, was also provided in the Annexure – III.

34.05 Training & Placement Report

The campus placement for the year 2022 was continuing, and college's placement assistance would continue for the unplaced students. Several companies physically / virtually visited the campus, and till then 27 companies either conducted interviews or had collected CVs for short listing for interview. Till then the college T&P cell had placed 97 (62 UG + 5 PG + 30 Diploma) students through offline/virtual interviews and about 70 students had expressed their willingness for higher studies both with the college as well as with other reputed national level institutions as per information available. The college was constantly updating the information for students who were being placed at various industries and Institutions as the hiring and admission process continued.

Like previous years, students were being encouraged to go for Industry/Hospital Training. However, the post-pandemic slowdown had severely impacted the training opportunity on site as many industries were not providing training slots or were not responding immediately to the college's requests. Still several students had completed or would be completing their training primarily from Sikkim / Baddi industrial belt, industries surrounding Kolkata and local hospitals. Several students had expressed their interest to get training from various hospitals, particularly, for Pharmacovigilance training in Govt. Hospitals. Likewise, interest for PV jobs was also on the rise, though that year the primary PV companies had not come to campus in significant hiring drive. The detailed report was presented by the Placement Officer, Mr. Sanjay Chattaraj and the data was given in Annexure - IV.

Discussion and Resolution:

A few problems of refusing job and training were raised by the Principal and the TPO.

Dr. Jaya Bandyopadhyay proposed to collect Parent's consent in this regard. She also advised the TPO to send request to the Employers for making a wait list during the recruitment process.

Dr. Satyajit Bose assured that he personally shall take initiatives for T & P by interacting with the high officials of Drug Companies who visit The Mission hospital.

Dr. Piyali Datta Chakraborty and Dr. Rahul Singh also assured that they shall try to make provision for training and projects for M. Pharm. Students at their respective organisation, if request from the college is sent.

The Chairman, BOG asked the Principal to send letter to the PCI requesting facilitation of GoI Training from their end.

Resolved that

- i. The TPO shall introduce Consenting System in Recruitment and Training drives.
- ii. The Principal shall send a letter to the PCI requesting facilitation of GoI Training from their end.

34.06 Current Strength of Faculty & Staff of the College

The current strength of faculty stood at 36 full time and 05 part time teachers. In between 33rd and 34th BOG meeting, four faculty, 3 Laboratory assistants and 1 Laboratory attendant joined the college. One faculty had resigned meanwhile. In her place, one faculty had been shortlisted (to join from 1st August 2022) for humanities after due process of advertisement, interview and selection committee recommendations. Total number of Ph.D among the faculty stood at 18 now (50% of the total full time strength).

34.07 Detailed Report of "Anti-ragging"

Being the Chairman of the Anti-ragging Committee of the Institution, the MS placed on record the Anti-ragging activities of College.

With the coming of the new batch of students to the campus and particularly to the Hostels, the college stepped up its active anti-ragging measures. R&D Report

(Report Period: 26th September 2021 to 24th June 2022)

After reopening of the college on ebbing of pandemic, the R&D activities of the college are slowly shaping up.

One of the encouraging developments for the college is a research grant secured by our Faculty Dr. Yadunandan Dey. He has secured a sum of Rs. 31.60 Lakhs as Start-up Research Grant from DST-SERB on 20th Jan 2022 on the project "Pharmacological Evaluation of Purified *Plumbago zelenica* roots on experimentally induced haemorrhoids in rats". The college management has rewarded the faculty with a token sum of Rs. 10000/- for this achievement.
