
A REPORT ON INDEPENDENCE DAY AND KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS. CELEBRATED ON 15th AUGUST, 2023.

"Amar Bhaier Rokte Rangano 21 February, Ami ki Bhulte Pari?" To translate "How can I forget my martyr brothers those who have sacrificed their life on 21st February, just to uphold the integrity and respect of their language?" The idea to celebrate International Mother Language Day was the initiative of Bangladesh. It was approved at the 1999 UNESCO General Conference and has been observed throughout the world since 2000.

Even though the majority of people in both East Pakistan and West Pakistan spoke Bengali or Bangla, the Pakistani government designated Urdu to be the only official language of the country in 1948. Since most individuals were from East Pakistan and spoke Bangla as their first language, the people there revolted. Together with Urdu, they insisted that Bangla be included as one of the official languages. On February 23, 1948, Dhirendranath Datta of East Pakistan made the initial demand in the Pakistan Constituent Assembly. To put an end to the demonstration, the Pakistani government banned public gatherings and demonstrations. The public helped the University of Dhaka students organize large-scale demonstrations and gatherings. On February 21, 1952, protesters were shot at by police. Along with hundreds of injuries, the deaths of Abdus Salam, Abul Barkat, Rafiq Uddin Ahmed, Abdul Jabbar, and



Shaffur Rahman occurred. This was one of the rare occasions in history when someone gave their life in defence of their mother tongue.

On 16 May 2007 the United Nations General Assembly in its resolution called upon Member States "to promote the preservation and protection of all languages used by peoples of the world". By the same resolution, the General Assembly proclaimed 2008 as the International Year of Languages, to promote unity in diversity and international understanding, through multilingualism and multiculturalism and named the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization to serve as the lead agency for the Year.

BCRCP fraternity also observed International Mother Language Day on 21st Pebruary, 2024 at APC Roy Seminar Hall. The program began with a welcoming address by Prof. (Dr.) Subhabrata Ray, Professor-in-charge PG Studies and Research who spoke about the importance of the day and why this day is celebrated worldwide. Upon finishing his engineering studies, he traveled to China, Japan, and the USA. After that, he graduated from MIT in the United States with a UG in chemistry and a PG in microbiology and chemistry. He established the United Provinces of Pharma Association in 1935. He oversaw the Indian Journal of Pharmacy as its editor. He was the founder of the Indian Pharmaceutical Congress, Bheshjayan, and Bhaishaj Patrika. In addition, he presided over the Pharmacy Council of India and the State Pharmacist Association. The IPA created the "Father of Pharmacy Award" in his honour.





CELEBRATED ON 29TH AUGUST, 2023.



As the selected theme of World Pharmacist's Day for 2023 is "Pharmacy strengthening health systems", Dr. Thakur discussed about the National Health Policy 2017 where he spoke about the aim and objectives of the same. He spoke on preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative services provided through public health centre, the role of Pharmacist in National Health Policy, the need for improving the public centre capacity for manufacturing essential drugs and vaccines, anti-microbial resistance, i.e., use of antibiotics in poultry farm and the use of pesticides, the mid-level service providers in pharmacy, the paramedical skill development for a pharmacist, professional education regulation, drug regulation, medical technological advancement, the role of central and state government in regulating health, the public healthcare structure in India and the National Public Health system of National Rural Health Mission.



Through his discussion on Kefauver- Harris Drug Amendment of 10th October 1963, the students gained knowledge that this amendment ensured reassessment of all medicines of US Market licensed between 1937-1942 for safety and efficacy. He also commented and elaborated on the Pharmacovigilance indicators of the World Health Organization, the strategy of the World Health Organization for monitoring a country's pharmaceutical situation. He also discussed the role of Pharmacists associated in different sectors. At the end Dr. Thakur also spoke on World Organ Donation Day in order to raise awareness about the importance of and help people understand organ donation. Organ transplantation can help in saving and transforming the lives of people who have been fighting to survive.


A REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY OBSERVED ON 21st JUNE, 2024.

Celebrated on 16th May, 2024.








