About the Institution

Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences (BCRCP), Durgapur is a premier pharmacy College of Eastern India. The College was established in September 2005 and is currently approved by AICTE, PCI and affiliated to MAKAUT, WBSCT and VE & SD, Gov. W.B. BCRCP prepares qualified, proactive, multi-dimensional, pharmacy professionals ready for global challenge. Nurturing the students of D. Pharm, B. Pharm. and M. Pharm. Courses, BCRCP creates a healthy and productive ambience where students can learn and develop. Recently, in the year 2020, two laurels, NBA accreditation and NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) were attached to the crown of BCRCP.



Strength of Faculty Members of the College

The faculty strength of the college now standing at 34 plus 7 faculty on PT ad-hoc basis, and additional 5adjunct faculty, out of which 18 faculty members possessed PhD degree and most of the others had already enrolled for PhD. We maintain healthy student-faculty ratio below 20:1 against 520 sanctioned seats.







Annual activities of the Institute During Academic Year 2018-2019

- Admissions to UG first year, UG lateral and PG courses of the College were excellent during the academic year with reduction of seats at UG level from 120 to 100 as mandated Pan Indian by PCI.
- Orientation Program for the new batch of AY 2018-19 was held on 31st July 2018 and regular classes started from 1st August 2018. A three-week Induction program for the new students was organized in accordance with the guidelines of AICTE and MAKAUT. The college organized several programs for the newly admitted students, viz., introduction to different facilities of the college, allotment and introduction of students to their respective mentors, visit to neighborhood areas including NIT, local markets, Missionaries of Charity, HOPE School, hospitals, etc, Yoga & Meditation sessions, cultural activities, technical activities like quiz, debates, interactive sessions with Psychological counselor, interaction with Ex-Students, Entrepreneurship Awareness program and likewise.
- In context with the new batch of B. Pharm students, preventive measures taken by our Anti ragging committee & Squad comprising of Faculty, Staff and Students of the college have been successful in maintaining our reputation as ragging free campus since inception.

Infrastructure developments

- In terms of infrastructure developments, a newly commissioned Language Laboratory started functioning from AY 2018-19 with the introduction of the communication skill software and audio-visual aids.
- Most classrooms were equipped with Smart Board system with internet connectivity for audio-visual aided interactive teaching-learning process.
- The AJC Bose Central Library was upgraded with new custom-made Library
 Management software with automatic scanning facility for speeding up the
 book dispensing process. The library infrastructure has also been revamped
 with partitioning between reading room and book storage areas, new
 counter for book lending and permanent provision for digital library facility.
- The Pharmacy Museum was renovated and installed at the ground floor of the UG building with adequate lighting systems wherein students have actively populated the shelves with models, samples and charts indicating various vistas of the Profession of Pharmacy. The facility was inaugurated on 15th August 2018 by the Hon'ble Society Members.
- The APC Roy Seminar Hall of the College has been renovated into a soundproof veneer paneled auditorium, boosting the ability of the college to host different techno-cultural events.
- The infrastructure of Hostel Canteen and Mess was also upgraded with introduction of gas bank, roti-maker, frying machine and marble flooring.
- The college had started a Medical Unit after signing MoU with The Mission Hospital, Durgapur to provide the facility.
- After successfully getting the trade license, the college opened PRADHAN MANTRI BHARTIYA JANAUSHADHI KENDRA at the college premises as per PCI requirements which was inaugurated on 04th July 2019 by Dr. Debasis Ghosh, Dy. Medical Superintendent of The Mission Hospital, Durgapur as an extension of social responsibility of the Management towards the adjoining locality. Through that outlet, students, faculty, staff and local people can procure quality generic medicine at an affordable price that is almost one-tenth of the branded counterparts.





Events held

- In 2018-2019, the college hosted an Up-gradation Training for Registered Pharmacists in collaboration with Indian Pharmaceutical Association (Bengal Branch) on 28th April 2018, attended by 120 participants, mostly the practicing Pharmacists, and some of the present & past students and teachers at the college.
- The college had submitted the NBA Pre-qualifier on 25th September 2018 and after a cohesive effort all the stakeholders of the institute, we finally submitted the complete SAR on 7th March 2019.

- Every outstanding presentation was felicitated with medals and merit certificates.







SECURED POSITIONS IN M. PHARM. 2017-2019 BATCH






Research in a Snapshot

Anupama Banerjee, Subir Chatterjee and Rupam Khatua discovered easy cheap UV-Visible spectrophotometric method to analyse the multiple drug contents in commercial cough syrup formulation which is currently under investigation in State Drugs Control and Research Laboratory, Kolkata, West Bengal for further developments. Ashik Chhetri, Suman Ghosh and Atanu Sinha Mahapatra published in house journal Pharmawave and Sujay Guti published in Drug Delivery Science and Technology (Elsevier). Tanushree Karmakar (M. Pharm.) published in Journal of Chromatographic Science (Oxford Academic Publication).





ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- The following passed out students secured the various positions in their respective B. Pharm and M. Pharm batches for Academic Year 2019-2020 w.r.t DGPA.












