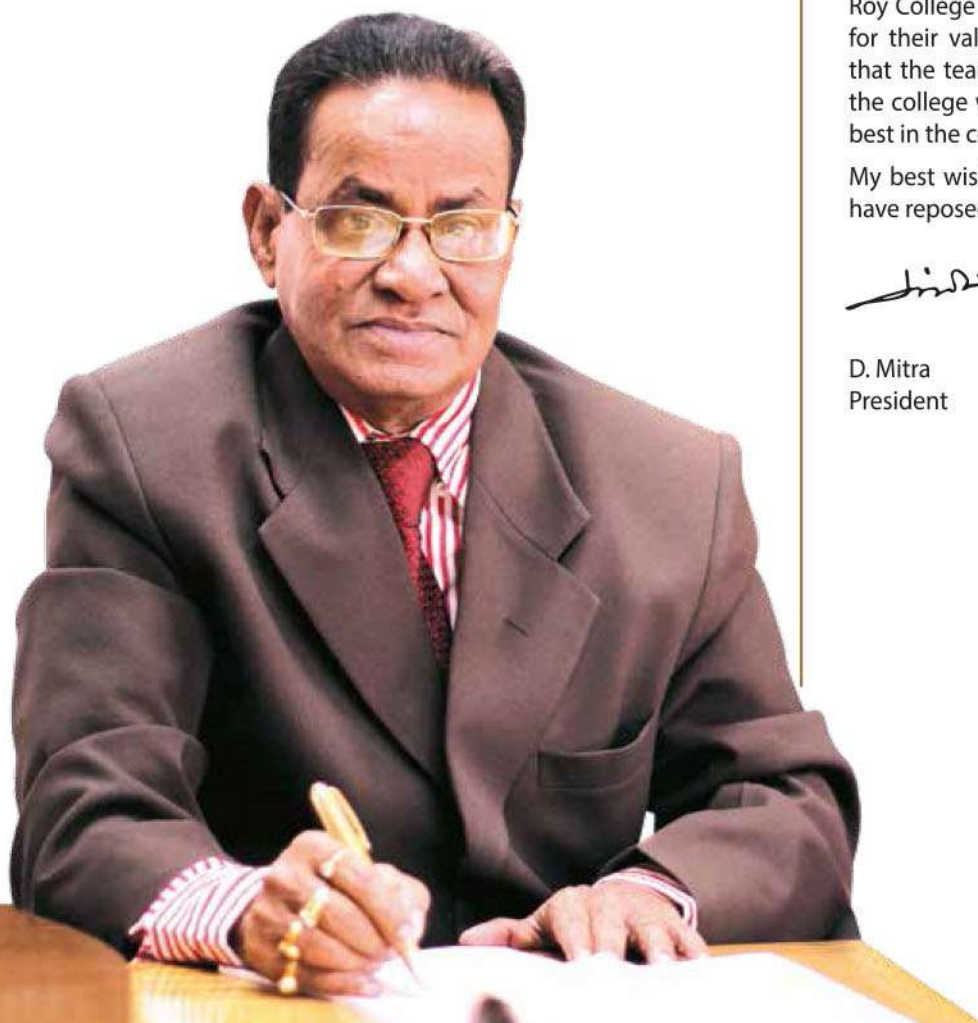


From the Director's Desk

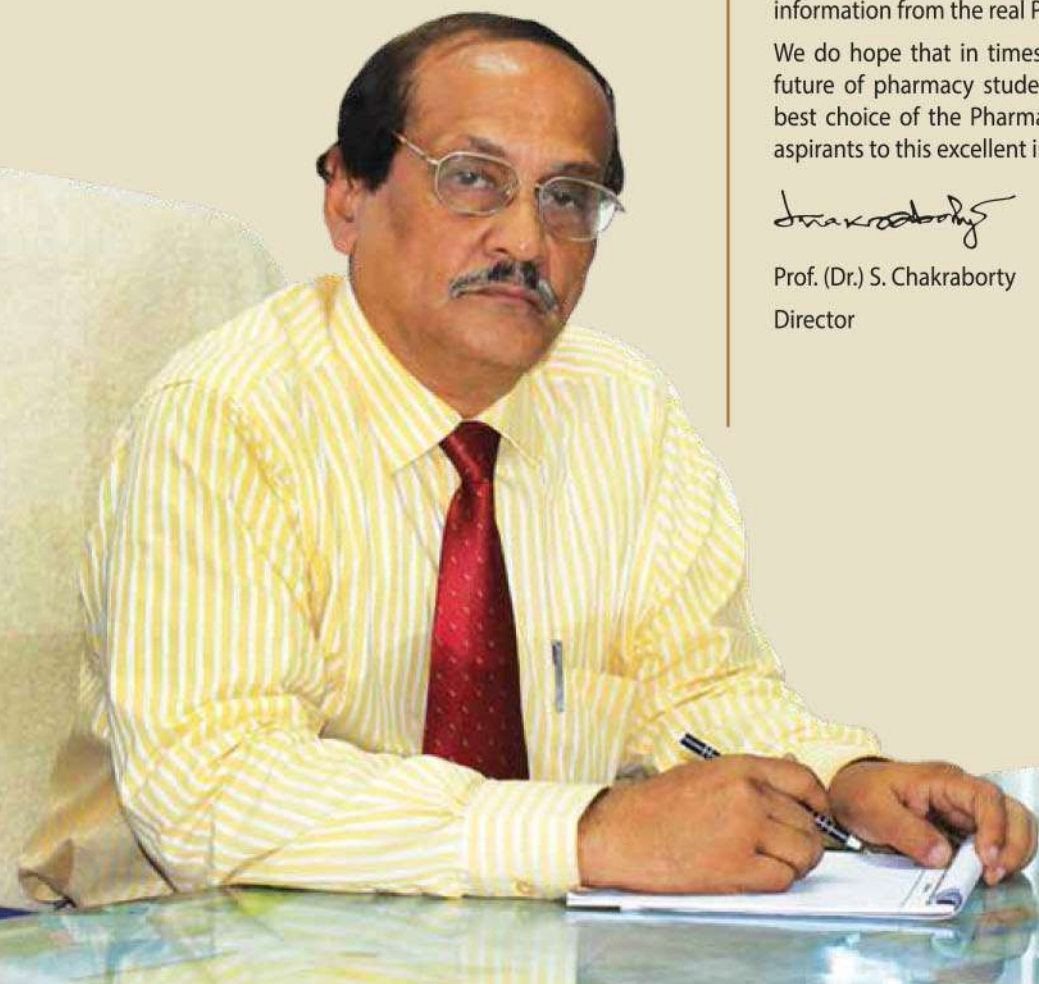

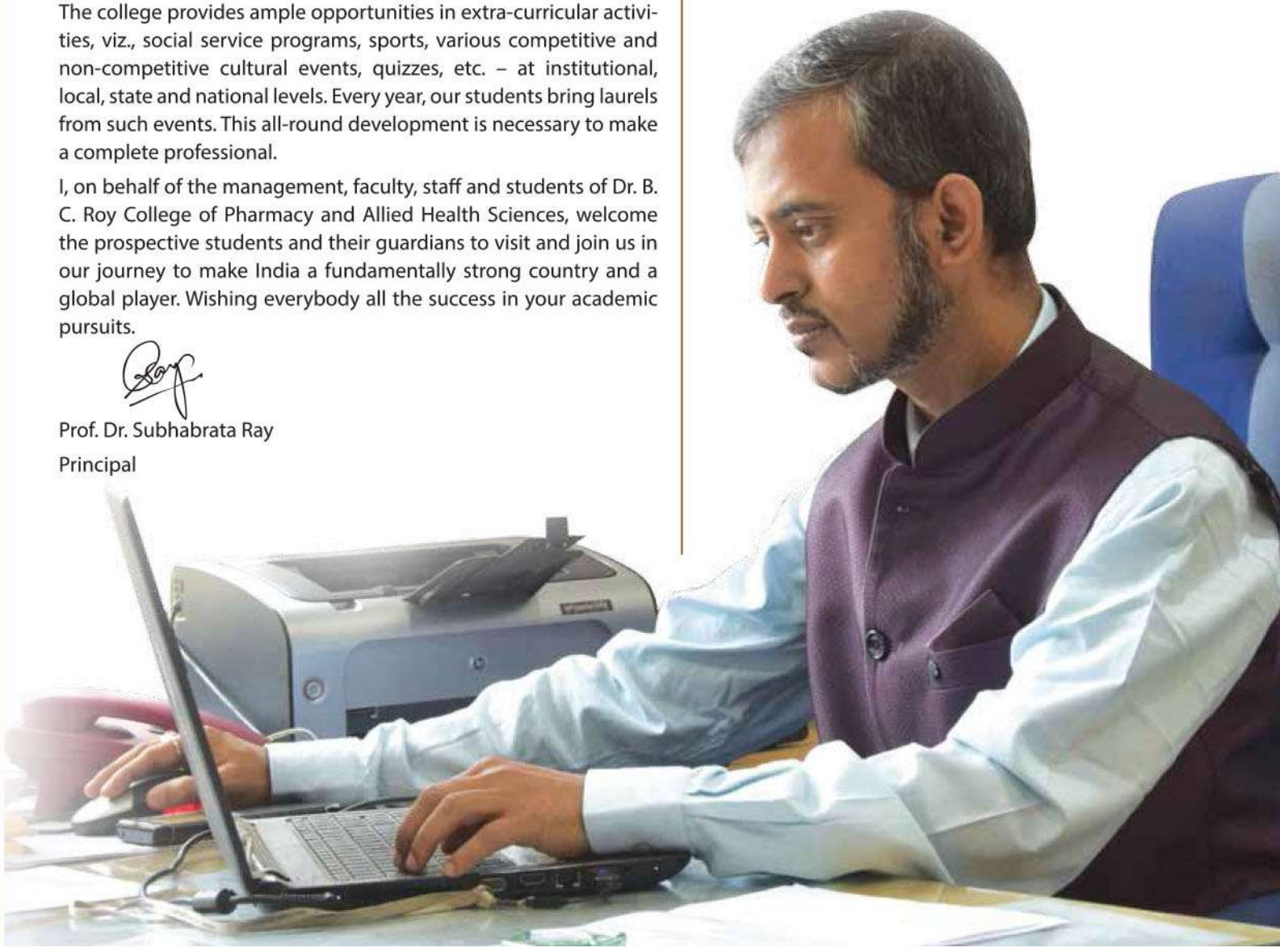

Location

Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences is located at the distinctive location just behind sub divisional Govt. Hospital of Durgapur town. It is in close proximity to vast knowledge application areas and resources.

Durgapur is one of the first planned kinetic industrial cities in the country founded in the late 50s by the Chief Minister of West Bengal, Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. It is the industrial hub of Eastern India and is the home of some of the major public and private sector enterprises belonging to the core sectors such as iron and steel, thermal power, cement chemicals, machinery and other allied industries. In the field of higher education, a deemed university and research establishments have given the city a national status. The city Durgapur, less than 3 hours by train or by bus from Kolkata, scores high by way of urban comforts, civic amenities and progressive social environment.

Hostel Accommodation

Infrastructure Support

The college provides state-of-the-art infrastructure support fulfilling all AICTE norms to all its students who are our greatest resource.

Classrooms

We provide well designed, well ventilated and well lit classrooms for enabling unhindered teaching and learning process with 'convenience' and 'care' as the key elements. The college has seven UG and 2 PG classrooms along with two UG tutorials as per the requirements of the regulatory bodies.

Laboratories

BCRCP has nineteen (19) well equipped spacious Departmental Laboratories for all the subjects of pharmaceutical sciences (Pharmaceutical Analysis, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmaceutics, Physiology, Pharmaceutical Engineering Drawing, Microbiology and Biotechnology, Bio-Pharmaceutics and Pharmacology) as per the educational regulations laid down by PCI, New Delhi as well as AICTE, New Delhi and MAKAUT, Kolkata. Experiments are designed on the basis of theory concept so that the students can understand easily.

BCRCP also has two PG laboratories and two PG research laboratories for specialization in different M. Pharm courses with sophisticated instruments like Dissolution Apparatus, Lyophilizer with deep freezer, Tablet Punching Machine (Ten Station). Probe Sonicator etc. and provide an ambience to create industry-friendly learning environment and also carry out M. Pharm projects smoothly and efficiently.

Animal House

BCRCP has an excellent and well maintained CPCSEA approved animal house with animals like rat, mice, rabbit etc. Observation room with air conditioned facilities, documentation room etc are also present. Institutional Animal Ethics Committee has been formed as per CPCSEA guidelines. The animal house is an added resource for the field of Pharmacology.

Medicinal Garden

The institute has developed a good number of medicinal and aromatic plants in its well organized Medicinal Garden. These medicinal plants enthuse the students to identify them for demonstration as well as extraction of different kinds of drugs and also to generate an aptitude for research in Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry.

Museum

A pharma museum with display of crude drug samples, photographs of medicinal plants, charts, proprietary medicines, containers, closures etc is established which is informative and educative.



Acharya J. C. Bose Central Library/Resource Centre

The Resource Centre of the college is the upgraded central library with a rapidly increasing collection of text books, reference books, journals, periodicals and CD ROM/DVD discs as well as e-learning facility. At present the library has 9479 number of books, 1010 number of titles, 27 number of journals both national and international. It also provides e-learning facility through DELNET. The library documentation is done through LIBSIS and works on open access system from 10:00 a.m to 5:30p.m daily except weekly and national holidays and is the best zone of the college where the students can develop the ability to learn independently and quietly.

Computer Facilities

The college started using computers from its very inception both in its academic and administrative activities. To cater computing needs to all students and faculty for their professional activities, BCRCP provides state-of-the-art computer laboratory. There are two clusters of modern state-of-the-art computer laboratories situated separately in the B. Pharm and M. Pharm buildings within the campus for the use of students and research scholars. The large number of PCs are all connected to the high speed campus LAN. The campus LAN is connected to the Internet through 16-Mbps, 1:1 connection. There are also high quality laser printers, DMP printers, scanners and multimedia projectors.

The B. Pharm computer laboratory is also designed to train the second year students in basic electronics and computer applications as well as to extend added training on computer aided drug design and molecular modeling (QSAR-study). Computer based MOOCS are also provided through SWAYAM site of GOI.

Acharya P. C. Roy Seminar Hall and Auditorium

The college has a fully equipped seminar hall and auditorium to conduct in-house as well as national seminars and conferences, tech fests and other college events.

Fire Fighting Arrangement

The institute maintains proper fire fighting arrangements to secure the well being of the students, faculty and staff members in case of any fire emergency.

Generator

Care for the students is our main priority and to provide them with comfort during power cuts, generator facility has been added.

Elevator

We believe in providing all state-of-the art infrastructure support. As part of infrastructural advancement, an elevator has been installed in our campus.

CCTV

Our campus is monitored 24x7 through CCTV cameras for safety, security and discipline.

Instrument Room

Centralized instrument room is present as an added facility to support experiments of various sorts carried out in the different laboratories. The center of attraction is HPLC, Spectrophotometer, Projection Microscope, Cooling Centrifuge, Trinocular Microscope, Elisa Reader and Washer, Rotary Vacuum Evaporator and Recirculating Chiller, Brookfield Viscometer with small volume attachment, High precision imported pH meter etc to name a few. Handling such sophisticated instruments facilitate first-hand knowledge of high-level industry instruments. Machine Room of the institute provides the facilities for pilot scale manufacturing of various pharmaceutical dosage forms, including tablets, semisolids etc.



Learning Support

Journals and Publications

The college library has a subscription to numerous national and international pharmacy journals that provide a constant learning support and reference for its students and faculties.

BCRCP publishes a yearly international journal of pharmaceutical technology "Pharmawave" with an ISSN no. 2249-3425 which encourages articles from professional and academicians on topics related to Pharmaceutical fields. The college also publishes an in-house magazine "Viewpoint: A Pharma Mag" to nurture young talents.

Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC)

The college has signed a MoU with Wadhani Foundation to become member of National Entrepreneurship Network (NEN) and encourages students to involve in additional activities for grooming them as future entrepreneurs and initiate their own start-ups during or after completion of their courses. Innovative ideas are nurtured through this cell in line with Govt. of India's Start-Up India Initiative.

An immediate success story of the EDC efforts is the launch of INFUNO (an automatic saline controlling device) through the start-up company Infuno Medical Engineering Pvt. Ltd, floated by one of our 2017 pass-out B. Pharm student.

E-learning and Internet Access

To focus on global vision and integration, the students are provided with the Edu-Sat distant learning facility and 24hrs internet to have access to subject experts in a multitude of disciplines.

- As a part of Digital India Initiative, the College has become member of NDL (National Digital Library), offered by IIT, Kharagpur, where students can access huge treasure-trove of knowledge from KG to PG and beyond without incurring any additional cost. The platform is also available in mobile phones.
- The college is also offering MOOCs (Massive Online Open Courses) through SWAYAM platform of Govt. of India, to empower students and encourage them in self-paced education.
- The college is also developing a fibre-optics backbone to provide very high speed data services with Wi-fi facilities in collaboration with Reliance JIO.

Scientific Seminars in the 2016-17 Academic Session

At Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences, young technologists are groomed with great care to equip them with both professional and personal skills which are the need of the day. A series of seminars and workshops are held throughout the academic session for a comprehensive teaching - learning process. Eminent personalities, scientists and experts from the Industry and Academia are invited on a regular basis to deliver lectures and presentations to update the students on contemporary scientific and professional issues. This academic year the following seminars were organized-

- As a part of the National Pharmacy Week celebration, a seminar session was organized to bring awareness on the theme of this year's NPW. Two eminent Physicians, Dr. Dibyendu De, Haematologist (Mission Hospital) and Dr. Rajarshi Mukhopadhyay, Endocrinologist (Mission Hospital) spoke on "Thalassemia Awareness" and "Type II Diabetes Mellitus".
- Prof. (Dr.) Samir Kumar Brahmachari, Ex-Director General, CSIR and S. S. Bhatnagar Award Winner (1990), an eminent scientist of international repute gave an enlightening presentation on "Crowd Sourcing Innovation for Real World Issues", wherein he explained to the young pharmaceutical technologists regarding Open Source Drug Discovery programs and how the system is solving drug discovery problems.
- Prof. (Dr.) Antony Gomes, Ex-Professor (Physiology), CU delivered a seminar on "Research Ethics for Young Students" to inculcate the value of professionalism and ethical conduct of research in the minds of our young students.
- Mr. Debasis Chatterjee, an Industry expert on Quality Management Systems, conducted a Seminar -cum-Workshop for 3rd and 4th year B. Pharm and M. Pharm students on "Quality Audit" - a very contemporary industrial aspect that the students regularly face when they join pharmaceutical production or QA/QC.

Bachelor Degree in Pharmacy (B-Pharm)

The programme has been designed to integrate the teaching of basic science along with the practice of pharmacy. The course emphasizes the importance of theoretical study, laboratory experiments and also of interdisciplinary communication and research. On the whole, it prepares a strong base for candidates who opt for higher study and research programme in the study of medicines.

Master Degree in Pharmacy (M-Pharm)

M. Pharm is a future oriented specialization programme in the field of pharmacy. It is designed for successful B. Pharm candidates to develop advanced laboratory skills and techniques for application within the pharmaceutical industry as well as spearhead innovative research ideas or further development. In short, it is a gateway for further higher studies to trigger constant up-gradation and rapid progress of pharmaceutical technology.

The four major departments offering M. Pharm are:

- PHARMACEUTICS deals primarily with extended study on drug dosage formulation, drug release pattern, kinetics study, bio-equivalence study and many more.
- PHARMACOLOGY deals with drug action in the biological system as well as check up the toxicity level of drug in the biological system.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

BCRCP believes in the overall growth of the students and cultivates the sense of social responsibility in them. We teach students to explore their potential as human beings by teaching them value and ethics. To increase their social involvement, various programs are organized at regular intervals. It is our endeavour to integrate the students into socially beneficial programs such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Community services, Health awareness dissemination, etc. through the NSS activities. In the academic year 2016-17 the major programs held were-

- A Pharma Rally "Walk for Diabetes" was held on the eve of National Pharmacy Week on 25-11-2016, in which the students, teachers and staff of BCRCP visited the nearby hospitals and community with banners and placards to raise awareness among common people about Diabetes. They visited S. D. Hospital, ESI Hospital, Mission Hospital, Vivekananda Hospital and BidhanNiramoy – prominent secondary and tertiary care hospitals in the vicinity of Durgapur.
- A Health Camp for the Needy and underprivileged people of the society was organized in association with Mission Hospital, Durgapur, at the College premises on 26-11-2016 under NPW celebration, where a large number of people of the underprivileged class were given free health consultation and tests such as blood pressure, blood sugar, ECG, ophthalmic and dental check-up were conducted.



Links with Industry

The institute has been successful in interacting with pharma industries from all over India through industry visits, vocational trainings and assistance in completing M. Pharm dissertations.

Industry visit: Industry visits are arranged for 3rd year students to acquire a knowledge of the recent developments and onsite functioning of pharmaceutical industries. This year they have visited several industries in Sikkim such as Alkem, STP Pharma, PTS Pharma, Zydus Cadila, Lupin etc.

Vocational Industry Training: Though industrial training is no longer mandatory within the B. Pharm curriculum, BCRCP has constantly tried to provide hands-on training to its students in industries like Emami, Ind-Swift Ltd, Albert David Ltd, Stadmed Pvt. Ltd., Sunpharma Industries, Baroda, Alkem Pharmaceuticals, Sikkim, Zuventus Pharmaceutical Ltd., Mumbai etc. during their summer vacations. This vocational training prepares the students to be industry-ready pharmacy graduates.

Every year students are encouraged and assisted to have hands-on training in Industries during their semester breaks. This year they have undergone their industrial training at Emami, Alkem, Glenmark, Cipla, Bengal Chemicals, Athena, East India Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Baidyanath, Benmed, Gluconet, Stadmed, Caplet India, Standard Pharmaceuticals, La-Chemico, Allied Analytics, etc. Apart from these, earlier students have visited industries like Ind-Swift, Albert-David, Sun Pharma, Juventus also.

MoU with Industries : The college has signed a MoU with Century Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Gujarat for collaboration on translational research, wherein our students and faculty have the opportunity to visit industrial research labs and carry out their research projects.

Four of our UG students under the mentorship of our faculty, have bagged a short-term research project from SRISTI-BIRAC [Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), DBT, Govt. of India and Society for Research and Initiative for Sustainable Technologies and Institutions (SRISTI)]

Admission

Admission Procedure for B. Pharm

The applicants will have to qualify West Bengal Joint Entrance (JEE) or AIEEE. 90% of the entrants are absorbed from the West Bengal Joint Entrance Examination and 10% students are admitted from AIEEE select list.

Eligibility Criteria

The applicant must be a citizen of India and should have passed the H.S. (10+2) or its equivalent examination from a recognized Council/Board with :

- Candidate must have passed '10+2' examination with Physics and Chemistry alongwith any one of Mathematics / Biotechnology / Biology / Computer Science /Computer Application as compulsory subjects with individual pass marks (in both theory and practical wherever applicable) in all the three subjects as stated above in regular class mode.
- Must have obtained at least 45% marks (40% in case of candidates belonging to reserved category) in the above three subjects taken together.
- Must have passed English in the '10+2' examination with at least 30% marks.
- The Board of the said Qualifying Examination must be recognized by the Central Government or State Government concerned.
- Candidate will have to qualify at the WBJEE or JEE (Mains) on the year of admission.

Lateral Entry

Admission through lateral entry to the 2nd year (3rd semester level) of the undergraduate degree courses offered by Government/Private Pharmacy colleges of the state of West Bengal during the Academic session 2017-18 is open to candidates who are-

- Citizens of india
- No upper age limit for Diploma holders in Pharmacy
- The candidate must pass Diploma in Pharmacy from AICTE approved Institution with at least 45% (40% for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA.
- Candidate should quality JELET 2017.

Admission Procedure for M. Pharm

The applicant must be a citizen of India and should have passed B. Pharm with first Class Degree or Equivalent from any recognized University. GPAT qualified candidates will be given preference. Applicants will be selected through University Selection test (PGET). Information Brochure and Application form can be downloaded from the University website (www.wbut.ac.in). Candidates without valid GPAT score and PGET are also eligible to apply subject to availability of seats.

Documents to be brought during admission

The date and time for the candidate to appear before the admission committee at Dr. B. C. Roy College of Pharmacy & AHS, Durgapur will be mentioned in the offer of admission or letter of call.

Only those candidates who appear before the admission committee on the date and time specified in the offer of admission or letter of call will bring the original documents as mentioned below and the fee for admission.

1. Admit card/certificate of respective board showing the candidate's date of birth/age (original + two Xerox copies)
2. Admit card of **WBJEE/JEE (Mains)** original + two Xerox copies
3. Mark-sheet of 10 and 10+2 examination (original + two Xerox copies)
4. 8 copies of stamp size coloured photograph
5. A recent certificate showing the powers of glasses for the candidates wearing glasses
6. Required amount of fee to be paid as fee for admission
7. A certificate from a registered medical practioner saying that the candidate has been recently inoculated against typhoid and cholera
8. Migration Certificate (those who are already registered in any University/Board other than WB Council)
9. Character Certificate from the head of the institution last attended
10. As per AICTE norms, in connection with the anti-ragging measures, affidavit in printed form (form will be provided by college) is to be submitted both from candidates and his/her guardian at the time of admission. Additional affidavit is required for candidate residing in hostel.
11. Candidates will be required to submit a Migration Certificate if he/she passes qualifying examinations from a board other than WBCHSE or a University other than WBUT. If the certificate is not submitted within the date specified by the University, the provisional admission of the candidate will stand automatically cancelled.

College Rules and Regulations

College Registration

All the students will have to register their names at the beginning of each semester. Failure to do so will debar them from all facilities.

Attendance

Each student is required to have at least 80% attendance in theory and practical classes; otherwise he/she will be debarred from appearing the semester examination under MAKAUT norms

Removal from college rolls

The name of the students will be automatically removed from the college roll if:

1. he/she fails to pay up his/her dues in time
2. he/she remains absent from classes or hostel for more than 15 days without prior intimation
3. he/she, otherwise eligible, does not deposit any examination or admission form without prior permission from the principal

Discontinuation of studies

In case a student opts for discontinuation of his/her studies in the stream he/she is enrolled, he/she will have to make payment of his/her tuition and development fees and only then, he/she will be issued transfer certificate. In case the student opts for joining other college, he/she must obtain NOC from the college giving a declaration that he or she had no claim whatsoever subsequently on the said seat. In case he/she does not obtain NOC, all deposits will be forfeited.

Discipline

Anti-Ragging Measures

As per the latest amendment to UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009 [<http://www.ugc.ac.in/page/Ragging-Related-Circulars.aspx>] ragging is defined as – “Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.”

Ragging in any form on any student inside or outside the college campus or hall of residence is strictly prohibited as per W.B. Govt. Anti-Ragging Act. Students found indulging in ragging shall be subject to strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the college. Supreme Court also has declared ragging as a nasty crime and advised for immediate serious action leading to even jail. The decision of the Principal and the anti-ragging committee regarding all matters on ragging based on the report of the anti-ragging committee will be final.
