





INFRASTRUCTURE

The college provides state-of-the-art infrastructure support fulfilling all PCI norms to all its students who are our greatest resource.

SMART CLASSROOMS

We provide well designed, well ventilated and well lit classrooms for enabling unhindered teaching and learning process with 'convenience' and 'care' as the key elements. These Classrooms are Smart Classrooms with Online Teaching and Lecture delivery facilities aided by Smart Boards and Projector Systems.

LABORATORIES

BCRCP has twenty (20) well equipped spacious Departmental Laboratories for all the subjects of pharmaceutical sciences (Pharmaceutical Analysis, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmaceutics, Physiology, Microbiology and Biotechnology and Pharmacology) as per the educational regulations laid down by PCI, New Delhi as well as MAKAUT, Kolkata. Experiments are designed on the basis of theory concept so that the students can understand easily.

Amongst these, BCRCP has four dedicated PG laboratories and four PG research laboratories for specialization in different M.Pharm courses with sophisticated instruments like Dissolution Apparatus, Lyophilizer with deep freezer, Tablet Punching Machine (Ten Station). Probe Sonicator etc.



and provide an ambience to create industry-friendly learning environment and also carry out M. Pharm projects smoothly and effectively.

LANGUAGE AND SIMULATION LABORATORY

A well equipped Language Laboratory helps students weak in English to hone up their Language Communication skills under the watchful eye of a full time faculty. The Lab is an air-conditioned networked computer aided facility with dedicated software for developing language skills. A Simulation Laboratory has been developed with dedicated software for the students to carry out software based pharmacology experiments.

ANIMAL HOUSE

BCRCP has an excellent and well maintained CPCSEA approved animal house with animals like rat, mice & rabbit. Observation room with air conditioned facilities, documentation room etc are also present. Institutional Animal Ethics Committee has been formed as per CPCSEA guidelines. The animal house is an added resource for the field of Pharmacology.

MEDICINAL PLANT GARDEN

The institute has developed a good number of medicinal and aromatic plants in its well organized Medicinal Garden. These medicinal plants enthuse the students to identify them for demonstration as well as extraction of different kinds of drugs and also to generate an aptitude for research in Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry. Each of our plant in the database has its own unique barcode (QR Code). These codes give students all the information they need to know about the tree -from its scientific name to its medicinal value.

MUSEUM

A pharma museum with display Of crude drug samples, photographs of medicinal plants, charts, proprietary medicines, containers, closures etc is established which is informative and educative.

RAIN WATER HARVESTING

The college promotes water conservation through Rain Water Harvesting and channeling the extra water to subsoil through the harvesting pit.

WASTE MANAGEMENT EFFORTS

Every effort is made to reduce, reuse and recycle the waste generated throughout the campus. Waste management efforts include collection and segregation of different types of waste (solid, liquid, electronic, biomedical, etc.) and its scientific disposal.

USE OF ALTERNATE SOURCES OF ENERGY

The college adopts energy conservation practices such as use of LED bulbs & monitors, sensors and has setup solar energy generation facilities as an alternate source of energy, which also feeds the grid with excess generation via net meter.

ACHARYA J.C.BOSE CENTRAL LIBRARY/RESOURCE CENTRE

The Resource Centre of the college is the central library with a collection of textbooks, reference books, Journals, Periodicals as well as rich e-learning facilities. The library plays a critical role in bestowing education and is the asset center point and the resource hub for knowledge. The library has a vast collection of books including 17091 volumes, Titles 2266, 32 print journals (National & International), 388 e-journals through DELNET, and 527 e-journals through Infotrac Pharmacy Collection (IPC). The library has made significant stride in terms of enhanced ICT services; the library is using cloud based Integrated Library Management Software KOHA 23.11 for its housekeeping and other activities. OPAC computerized system of ILMS is provided to the students which facilitates them to have a glance at the number of books available, number of issued books, new books added to the list which helps them to issue the correct book when required. The seating capacity of the library is around 100 with internet enabled six multi-media computers. The library is a member of the National Digital Library of India (NDLI) and DELNET. Reprography and Document scanning facility is available in the library. The library works on an open access system from 10.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. daily except Saturday and Sunday.

DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY (D. PHARM)

The program has been designed to provide technical education and skill to enable the students to work competently as health care professionals in the industry, hospital and retail sector. The course will prepare a strong foundation for the candidates to work in the hospital sector where they play a very important role in efficient handling of medicines, inventory management, preparation of hospital formulary and assisting the physicians in patient care. Pursuance of the course will open up opportunities for studying B. Pharm via lateral entry in the 2nd year.

BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. PHARM)

The programme has been designed to integrate the teaching of basic science along with the practice of pharmacy. The course emphasizes the importance of theoretical study, laboratory experiments and also of interdisciplinary communication and research. On the whole, it prepares a strong base for candidates who opt for higher study and research programme in the study of medicines.

MASTER OF PHARMACY (M. PHARM)

M. Pharm is a future oriented specialization programme in the field of pharmacy. It is designed for successful B. Pharm candidates to develop advanced laboratory skills

and techniques for application within the pharmaceutical industry as well as spearhead innovative research ideas for further development. In short, it is a gateway for further higher studies to trigger constant up-gradation and rapid progress of pharmaceutical technology.

The four major departments offering M. Pharm are:

- ✓ **PHARMACEUTICS** deals primarily with extended study on drug dosage formulation, drug release pattern, kinetics study, bio-equivalence study and many more.
- ✓ **PHARMACOLOGY** deals with drug action in the biological system as well as check up the toxicity level of drug in the biological system.
- ✓ **INDUSTRIAL PHARMACY** deals with studying all unit operations involved in drug delivery manufacturing, scale up, processing and development of drug delivery systems and dosage forms at the industrial level.
- ✓ **PHARMACEUTICAL ANALYSIS** deals with the process for identification, determination, quantification and purification of a substance, separation of the components of a solution or mixture, or determination of structure of chemical compounds.

Social Responsibility Events

The institute has an active and MAKAUT-recognized NSS Wing that regularly conducts impactful social activities such as tree plantation drives, winter cloth donation, blood donation camps, free health check-up camps, collaborations with NGOs, and plastic waste collection on World Environment Day. Bachelor of Pharmacy (B. Pharm)

- A recent certificate showing the powers of glasses for the candidates wearing glasses
- Required amount of fee to be paid as fee for admission
- Migration Certificate (Those who are already registered in any University other than MAKAUT, WB)
- Registration Certificate (Original) for B. Pharm passout of MAKAUT, WB and two xerox copies.
- Character Certificate from the head of the institution last attended
- Allotment Letter Of WBJEE/WBSCT & VE & SD for Centralized Counselling allotted candidate.
- Aadhar card Original + Two xerox copies.
- Photocopies of Pharmacists Registration Certificate (M. Pharm / B. Pharm. Lateral entry Applicants)
- Domicile certificate is required at the time of admission.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

COLLEGE REGISTRATION

All the students will have to register their names at the beginning of each semester. Failure to do so will debar them from all facilities.

ATTENDANCE

Each student is required to have at least 75% attendance in theory and practical classes; otherwise he/she will be debarred from appearing the semester examination (For B.Pharm & M.Pharm) under MAKAUT norms. (80% attendance for Diploma students is mandatory as per PCI norms)

REMOVAL FROM COLLEGE ROLLS

The name of the students will be automatically removed from the college roll if:

- he/she fails to pay up his/her dues in time
- he/she remains absent from classes or hostel for more than 15 days without prior intimation
- he/she, otherwise eligible, does not deposit any

examination or admission form without prior permission from the Principal

DISCONTINUATION OF STUDIES

In case a student opts for discontinuation of his/her studies in the stream he/she is enrolled, he/she will have to make payment of his/her due semester fees and only then, he/she will be issued transfer certificate. In case the student opts for joining other college, he/she must obtain NOC from the college giving a declaration that he or she had no claim whatsoever subsequently on the said seat. In case he/she does not obtain NOC, all deposits will be forfeited.

DISCIPLINE

All students must abide by the rules and standing orders of the college, violation of which or any misconduct inside or outside the college campus may lead to disciplinary action as per the regulations and render a student liable to expulsion from the college. Students have to sign an undertaking to this effect for the above during admission. Further, if as a result of any demonstration or

strike, any college property is damaged, the cost will be covered directly from the students who are identified or collectively from such group of students who are responsible for it. In case of non-identification of any student(s) mass fine shall be imposed thereon.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEE(GRC)

The College has a well defined Online Grievance Redressal Mechanism through a duly constituted Committee for all stakeholders.

ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES

The College ensures Ragging Free environment for healthy and holistic learning. Anti-Ragging banners and Hoardings are displayed at prominent places in the campus and Anti-Ragging Squads keep constant vigil. Awareness among all stake holders regarding Anti-Ragging measures are constantly disseminated.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

As per the sexual harrasment of Women at Workplace (Preverntion , Prohibition and Redressal) Rules, 2013, our Institute has an ICC for considering complaints for sexual harrasments of women working and studying in the Institute. The complaint can be made either in paper form or through My Grievance in the Institute web page <https://bcrcp.net/login.php>. As per Act, aggrieved woman can make written complaint of sexual harassment at workplace to the ICC within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of a series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of last incident.; while in case the

aggrieved woman is unable to make a complaint on account of her physical incapacity, a complaint may be filed inter alia by her relative or friend or her co-worker or any person who has knowledge of the incident, with the written consent of the aggrieved womankind complaints of sexual harassment of women employees and girl students. Once a complaint is submitted, it will be directly sent to the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) and subsequent actions are taken. The major functions of the Internal Complaints Committee involve implementing the Policy relating to the prevention of sexual harassment, resolving complaints by the aggrieved and recommending actions to be taken by the employer.

GENDER EQUALITY

The institute, being a co-educational college has gender-neutral policies that ensure promotion of gender equality in various areas of operation. Special drives are taken to sensitize the students to spread awareness regarding gender issues for preventing any kind of discrimination whatsoever through Women's Empowerment programs, Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) following the SAKSHAM guidelines, Anti-Discrimination Cell, Grievance Redressal Committee, Code of Conduct and Disciplinary Committee. minimum 75% of attendance for theory lectures & 90% of practical session separately is compulsory for each subject. (For D. Pharm. 80% attendance is mandatory). Failing to attain such percentage of attendance, no student shall be allowed to appear in the University/ Council's Exam.

BARRIER FREE ENVIRONMENT

POLICY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES [DIVYANGJAN]

Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 of the United Nations General Assembly prohibits discrimination against individuals with physical and mental disabilities, Dr. B. C.
